Police Advice

- 1) **To report a crime**, call **101** or go **online to www.met.police.uk**. In an **emergency**, call **999**
- 2) Take a **photograph** of your valuables. It is the only way the police can prove it belongs to you if a burglar is stopped or stolen property retrieved. It also helps insurance claims.
- 3) **Mark** your jewellery by using a traceable liquid such as 'SmartWater'.
- 4) **Avoid** keeping jewellery in your bedrooms and bathrooms – these are often the first places a burglar will look.
- 5) **Consider Installing** intruder burglar **alarms** and outside **security lights**.
- 6) **Leave some lights** on and use timer switches when you go out.
